This application is made in accordance with and under the rules of the LRTC Tariff No. 006.

Application for berthing dates may be made no more than 60 days before or less than 72 hours before the anticipated date of arrival at LRTC. Vessels shall be scheduled for berthing in the order applications are received and accepted, subject to berth availability. **No vessel shall be permitted to berth at LRTC without having first made application for a berth and without a berthing arrangement having been granted.** LRTC will make its best efforts to make a berth available when the vessel arrives.

The application and subsequent requirements shall be made by fax and restricted to the following:

- a) No earlier than 60 days before the anticipated arrival, the applicant shall furnish the anticipated estimated time arrival date (ETA) and the laydays on either side of the ETA, in accordance with the Table, above.
- b) If Berth Application is submitted prior to 30 days before anticipated date of arrival at LRTC, an updated ETA must be submitted at 30 days. Laydays will then be adjusted as defined in Column C above.
- c) 72 hours before the anticipated arrival, the actual arrival date and time shall be confirmed.
- d) 24 hours before the arrival, the hour of arrival shall be specified.
- e) Berth B has a restricted draft and can accommodate vessels with LOA of 650 feet or less.

Note: Notice of Readiness shall be presented in writing by the ship's agent to LRTC only after the vessel is at berth, customs cleared, surveyed and with the hatches open ready for loading or discharge, or at anchorage if the berth is occupied. Time to count 24 hours after acceptance of NOR unless otherwise specified by contract.
